Your Health, Your Choice

In England, the NHS works in partnership with independent healthcare providers to offer quality, local care and reduce waiting lists.

This makes the NHS **faster**, **simpler** and **fairer** for everyone that uses it. As an NHS patient in England, you have a legal right to choose where you go for most non-urgent treatment that requires referral.

The NHS call this, Patient Choice

This means that just like you have the right to choose which supermarket you buy your groceries, you also have the right to choose where you receive your healthcare.

Treatment is free of charge for patients, and doesn't cost the NHS any more than if they were delivering the service in an NHS hospital.

75% of the public agree that they should have a right to choose their provider.



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Nearly half of adults are unaware that they have a legal right to choose.

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My Choice

You will be offered a minimum of 5 treatment options, these will include both NHS and independent providers and will be tailored to your individual needs and preferences, where possible.

A recent report^{*} found that patients want to be given a choice and, when offered it, can cut on average over 3 months off their wait for NHS care by exercising their right to choose a different provider.

How Do I Make My Choice?

It might feel a little overwhelming to choose where you have your NHS treatment. Our helpful guide suggests some deciding factors you might want to consider when making your care choices.

It's important to know that all independent healthcare providers are inspected and monitored by the Care Quality Commission, so you can rest assured knowing they have the same standards you would expect in an NHS Hospital.

To make your decision you could consider;

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Waiting lists

Want to be seen sooner? With patient choice you are able to pick a hospital with shorter waiting times and can see you sooner.



Convenience

You might want to choose a hospital near where you live or work, or a hospital that offers a transport service if it makes it easier to attend appointments.



Near friends and family

You can choose a hospital close to family and friends, so you have peace of mind that they can support you during your treatment and recovery.



Recommendations

You could consider a hospital that has been recommended by a friend, or by quality ratings, reviews, or personal experience.

Visit your GP or Optician

They will diagnose your condition and refer you onto a specialist eye hospital for your treatment.
